IPCC Sixth Assessment Report

Eight years of research from more than 14,000 papers have been telescoped into the exhaustive new IPCC report. The World Bank and the Korea Green Growth Trust Fund are needed now more than ever to support countries around the world identify and implement green growth policies that will pull humanity back from the brink of climate catastrophe.

"For the first time in an IPCC report, assessed future change in global surface temperature is explicitly constructed by combining scenario-based projections with observational constraints and the updated assessment of climate sensitivity. The assessment indicates that global surface temperature averaged over the next 20 years is expected to reach or exceed 1.5 degree Celsius of warming. In addition, by 2030, global surface temperature in any individual year could exceed 1.5 degree Celsius relative to 1850-1900 with a likelihood between 40% and 60%, across the five scenarios. Global warming of 1.5 and 2 degree Celsius will be exceeded during the 21st century unless there are immediate, rapid and large-scale reductions in greenhouse gas emissions."
