Background of K-WASH



- Anchored in Kenya National Water and Sanitation Investment and Financing Plan (NAWASIP) 2022–2030
- Focus areas
 - Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Services Improvement and,
 - Water Sector Efficiency Improvement and Policy Reforms

- Six-Year Program (2024–2030) covering 19 counties (subnational governments).
- First scaled up results-based (PforR) program in Kenya's water sector



Overview and Funding



- USD 458 million program to expand access to safe water and sanitation services
- Financed through GoK, World Bank and Commercial Financing.
- Implemented by the Government of Kenya through the Ministry of Water, Sanitation, and Irrigation.
- Emphasis on:
 - Universal WASH access
 - Climate-smart investments
 - Sustainable service delivery



K-WASH Program Development Objective (PDO)



• To increase **sustainable access** to improved water and sanitation services, eliminate open defecation, and **enhance the financial performance of Water Service Providers** (WSPs) in selected counties, including those hosting refugees.

Key Outcomes:

Outcome	Indicators
Improved Water Access:	4 million people (50% women, 320,000 refugees)
Improved Sanitation and Hygiene:	 4 million people (50% women, 320,000 refugees) Increased proportion of communities certified as open defecation free
Improved Financial Performance:	Participating WSPs achieve 100% of their Operating Cost Coverage Ratio (OCCR) targets



Role of KGGTF Support



- Provided critical technical and analytical support for implementation of K-WASH through the development of
 - > County Water and Sanitation Strategies and Investment and Plans (CWSSIPs)
 - > Performance Improvement Action Plans (PIAPs).
 - > Capacity building and knowledge exchange internally and with Korean Agencies
- CWSSIPs and PIAPs are the basis for investments under the Program.
- Strategic planning helps to generate direct and indirect and sustainable jobs.
