
KGGTF: A Truly Global Program

Toward a Sustainable Future in Industrial Parks

Approved: 2021 | Grant: \$700K

POLICY INFLUENCE

Applied Korea–UNIDO–GIZ Eco-Industrial Parks (EIP) model, shaping national policy.

INVESTMENT LEVERAGE

PPP roadmap for Caracol Park; guided \$75M WB lending.

CAPACITY BUILDING

Trained 50+ managers, benefiting 35K workers in the garment sector.

SCALABILITY

Korea-supported EIP model replicated for green job creation.



BANGLADESH

Strengthening Air Quality Governance & CEMP Scale-up

Approved: 2022 | Grant: \$600K

VISIBILITY

Nationwide outreach reached 100K+ citizens on air quality.

POLICY INFLUENCE

Korea's KECO–KEITI expertise shaped Construction Environmental Management Plan & National Air Quality Management Plan 2030.

INVESTMENT LEVERAGE

Backed \$500M WB lending for clean air & green growth.

CAPACITY BUILDING

50 officials trained via Korean-led workshops.



VIETNAM

Green Agriculture Digital Traceability Program

Approved: 2020 | Grant: \$400K

POLICY INFLUENCE

Korea's digital traceability know-how informed Agri Green Growth Plan.

INVESTMENT LEVERAGE

Linked to \$454.9M WB lending & co-financing; IFC trade facilitation.

CAPACITY BUILDING

340 participants trained with Seoul Nat'l Univ. experts.

SCALABILITY

Integrated into \$350M WB Mekong Delta & Transformative Carbon Asset Facility rice program.



MEXICO

Smart Farming for a Greener Mexico

Approved: 2021 | Grant: \$400K

POLICY INFLUENCE

Korean RDA & Nare Trends guided FIRA's smart-farm strategy.

INVESTMENT LEVERAGE

Linked to \$250M lending + \$129M co-financing; 3 Technological Development Centers, 8 greenhouses built.

CAPACITY BUILDING

Korea-led training & study tours for Mexican experts.

SCALABILITY

National expansion plan; benefits 12M+ people across 3 regions.



AFRICA

Unlocking Urban Mobility in Four East African Cities

Approved: 2022 | Grant: \$450K

POLICY INFLUENCE

Enhanced urban transport planning in 4 nations using Korean models.

INVESTMENT LEVERAGE

Linked to \$100M lending + \$139.8M co-financing.

CAPACITY BUILDING

55 practitioners trained; 10 leaders joined the Korea study tour (KOTI).

SCALABILITY


Technical Assistance expanded to Kinshasa (DRC); Kigali & Kampala ready for FY25 launch



PHASE 4 PRIORITIES

Priorities for KGGTF Phase 4 (2024-2027) were defined through 136 surveys, 30 interviews, and consultations with donors and stakeholders

- 1. Maximize Green Growth Investments
- 2. Build Implementation-oriented Partnerships (TEG)
- 3. Mobilize Private Sector Engagement (PEG)
- 4. Inspire Youth Engagement (AYG)

YOUTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

KGGTF Youth Internship Program

- Six-month program fostering the next generation of green growth leaders
 - through hands-on experience with World Bank operations, mentoring, and field visits in Korea.
- Results over two cycles (2023-24, 2024-25)
 - 34 interns trained with 100% satisfaction
 - 13 hired at WB, GGGI, UNDP, and others
 - 4 admitted to advanced degrees
- Strengthening global green growth talent pipeline


