## Nicolas Peltier, Global Director, ITRDR, World Bank Group

Nicolas Peltier-Thiberge is the Global Director for Transport in the World Bank's Infrastructure Practice Group. He joined the Bank in 2002 as a Young Professional and has since managed transport operations across Africa, the Middle East, Latin America, and the Caribbean. From 2012 to 2015, he served as Portfolio Assistant in the Office of the World Bank Group President, and from 2015 to 2022, he was Practice Manager overseeing transport programs in several regions before becoming Global Director in 2022.

Before joining the World Bank, he worked in the French Ministry of Economy and Industry and the French Treasury. He holds graduate degrees in science, civil engineering, and technology policy from École Polytechnique, École des Ponts et Chaussées, and MIT.

Matthias Plavec is part of the World Bank's Global Transport Unit, where he advances the Bank's work on railways and logistics, with a particular emphasis on the financing and organization of railway services. As part of the Austrian Federal Ministry for Transport and Climate Action, he was instrumental in introducing the "climate ticket", a nationwide public transport flat-rate ticket. 
