Seoul's Development Process

Rising from the ruins of the Korean War (1950–1953) to Global City today

1960 ~ 1979

Infrastructure Expansion Period

- Establishment of the New Seoul Master Plan (1966), the Gangnam Development Plan (1970), and the Yeouido Development Plan (1971)
- Designation of 12 redevelopment zones for the first time (1973), opening of Subway Line 1 (1974), expansion of the Hangang Bridge

1980 ~ 2000

Urban Growth Period

- Hangang Comprehensive Development Project (1982), Construction of Mokdong, Sanggye, and Junggye-dong Collective Housing Complexes (1985), and Announcement of Plans to Build 180,000 Housing Units in Bundang and Ilsan (1989)
- Completion of Jamsil Baseball Stadium (1982), Opening of Olympic Boulevard (1986), Opening of Subway Lines 2~4 (1984~1985),
 Implementation of Garbage Separation System (1992), Implementation of Bus Card System (1996), Opening of Subway Lines 5~8 (1995~2000)



Sustainable City

1960

- Cheonggyecheon Stream Restoration Project (2004), Reorganization of Public Transportation System (2004), Installation of Subway Screen Doors (2006~)
- Initiation of Hangang Renaissance Project (2007), Opening of Subway Line 9 (2009), Restoration of Gwanghwamun Square (2009), Opening of DDP (2014)
